

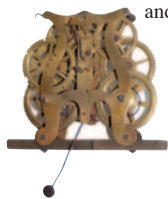
**909.** Southern Calendar Clock Co. "Fashion" clock finials. Turned identical to the originals, needing only light sanding and staining. These finials were in the LaRose Company sale thirty years ago, and are made from fine walnut wood. Indicate if you want more than one set. \$40-\$50.



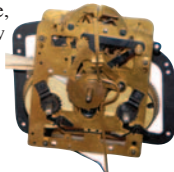
**910.** Oak dovetailed box with brass escutcheon, heavy duty lock and a key. The nice box is 18" long, 11" wide, and 7.5" high. Two large hinges for the top lid. It has a very good original finish, clean, and polished. \$100-\$150.



**911.** Seth Thomas 8day lyre movement, seat board mount, two weight. Complete, signed, has the eagle imprint and "18". No verge. \$50-\$100.



**912.** German kitchen clock works, runs but has short swing, no striking spring. Signed that it was made in West Germany. Numbers imprinted are, "32cm / 122.8 / 70 / 151.020". New or near new. \$10-\$25.



**913.** New 31 day automatic striking movement, 9" front pendulum. Bought new in 1974, never used. Included is the pendulum, gong, and key. \$25-\$50.



**914.** New 31 day Ansonia type calendar movement. Invoice says it is a 19" front pendulum and has 11" hands. There is no pendulum or hands. Gong and pendulum bob are in the box. \$25-\$50.



**915.** Clock shelf that is very different. It has square nails meaning old, how old I am not at all sure. Painted designs on the front. The shelf top is 14" wide, 5.5" deep. The painted section drops down 15" below the shelf top. \$75-\$150.



**916.** Oak clock shelf that is very different from the normal shelves we get. The top is 23" wide, 7.5" deep. Two small shelves and a mirror, below. \$50



**917.** German ceramic plate clock, now with a battery movement. The plate is signed, "8 Day / Germany", and has the crossed arrows trademark. The bowed plate retains the four screws to hold the correct movement which should easily be available on a broken plate. This flo blue ceramic plate with Dutch scenes is very collectable. \$25-\$50.



**918.** "Jewel Pin-Up" radio/clock by the Jewel Radio Corp. New York City. In a bakelite type case, radio knobs on the side, clock knob on the back. The clock and radio are both working. I would suspect it is collectable as a radio, not a clock. \$50-\$100.



**919.** Mini one weight novelty cuckoo clock and it is running. It has a very long chain but it probably needs it to run one day. \$10-\$25.



**920.** Wicker rocking chair that belonged to my grandfather. Lee Sanders, the same line as the famous, Colonel Sanders of Kentucky Fried Chicken fame. He lived and died in the Harrodsburg, Kentucky area. James Harrod established Fort Harrod in 1774 and it was to become the first permanent settlement west of the Appalachian Mountains. The chair is ca early 1900's. It had been painted white before I acquired it some 30 years ago and I have since painted it again. We have been using it on our sun porch but there are too many chairs, so some must go. \$75-\$150.



**921.** Antique iron bed, full size, complete and in good condition, with rails and slats. It has been painted white recently, other colors underneath the white. The bed belonged to my grandparents who had in the late 1800's, and came to me when they passed in the 1930's. We have loaned it out to children and grandchildren but has now come home for the last time. In our part of the country decorators acquire most of the iron beds and use them in the new million dollar homes. If no one is interested in this auction we will donate it to a needy family. \$50-\$100.



**922.** Gallery, case only. Beautiful oak case is 15" across the back, 12" dial pan. No back on the case, no movement or dial. Brass bezel is hinged, good glass. What is there is really nice. \$10-\$25.



**923.** Dremel Moto-Tool Drill Press Model 210. The press is 14" tall. Can be used as pictured or the hand drill can be removed from the press and used manually. Complete and like new condition. \$25-\$50.



**924.** Webster Escape Wheel Tooth Straightener. The company's hype says, "once you learn how to use the tool, you will wonder how you got along without it." Comes with instruction for its use. \$10-\$25.



**925.** Tiny "One Dose Medicine Bottle" from "Sultan Drug Co., ca 1890's. The bottle is signed, "O.P.S. / Co. / U.S.A.". The lid is signed, "Sultan". Both of the companies were domiciled in St. Louis, Mo. and made patent medicines. Why am I including a 2" medicine bottle in this auction? Primarily because I am goofy like most clock collectors. Also, I figure there are other clock collectors out there that collect bottles. I recently bought a clock collection from a collector who had collections of many things, one being old bottles. He said this "One Dose Medicine Bottle" was found in the gold fields of California. Miners carried small bottles of patent medicine. Sultan Drug Co. was known for something called "cactina pellets". There are some of the pellets still in this bottle. Cactina pellets was said to be, "of immense value in the treatment of those diseases in which the action of the heart and the circulation are of vital importance". Everyone needs some of those pellets. Value? I do not have a clue. It may be worthless.
